SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SSI)

This sheet and Addendum A are supplements to Appendix S of the Racing Rules of Sailing (page 146 RRS 2021-2024).

RULES

SSI 1.1 The Nelson City Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2019 shall apply.

SSI 1.2 When transiting the Cut, no boat shall pass between the 'Mole' breakwater and the Green Pile.

NOTICES TO COMPETITORS (SI 2)

SSI 2 The race office is located in the Nelson Yacht Club Control Room. Telephone 022 548 7501, Email <u>info@nelsonyachtclub.org.nz</u> The official notice board is located at the Nelson Yacht Club Lower Lounge.

SIGNALS MADE ASHORE (SI 4)

SSI 3 Signals ashore will be displayed on the flagstaff located at Nelson Yacht Club.

SSI 4 [DP] Flag D with one sound means competitors may launch. Boats shall not leave the shore until this signal is made.



For sailing **outside** the Boulder Bank, the warning signal will not be made before the scheduled time or less than 30 minutes after flag D is displayed.

For sailing **inside** the Boulder Bank, the warning signal will not be made before the scheduled time or less than 15 minutes after flag D is displayed.

SSI 6 On 1st December 2024, no warning signal will be made after 1600hrs.

STARTING DIVISIONS AND FLAGS (SI 6)

NB. Whilst this sequence of starts is likely for the first race of the day, subsequent races may be started in any order.

COURSES (SI 7)

SSI 8 The courses to be sailed, the order in which the marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left are shown in Addendum A.

SSI 9 In the event that a gate mark is missing and has not been replaced with an object displaying flag M, the remaining mark shall be rounded to port.

MARKS (SI 8)

SSI 10 The description of the marks is in the table in Addendum A.

THE START (SI 9)

- **SSI 11** When a starting sequence is in progress, boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. The starting area is defined as the area 50 metres from the starting line and marks in all directions.
- **SSI 12** A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and 5.2.

TIME LIMITS (SI 12)

There is no prescribed time limit for the first boat to pass mark 1.

PENALTY SYSTEM

SSI 14 For skiff (Eg. 29er), catamaran, and the Zephyr classes, rule 44.1 is changed so the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.

CHECK OUT AND CHECK IN

SSI 15 Boats shall comply with the following check out and check in procedure:


- a) We are using a tablet-based digital check-out / check-in system.
- b) All normal entries will be pre-loaded into the system.
- c) Late Entries may have to create a sailor entry in the system.
- d) [DP][NP] On each day of racing, competitors shall individually Check-Out using the system on the club tablet.
- e) [DP][NP] Competitors shall individually Check-In immediately on returning to shore after racing, no later than the protest time limit, using the system on the club tablet.


SUPPORT VESSELS

SSI 16 All official and support vessels shall always have an engine safety cut-out switch (kill cord) attached to the driver while the engine is running, unless prior written exemption has been provided by the Organising Authority.

For clarity, all courses are shown below. The Race Committee will give an indication of likely courses for each class or starting division at the briefing. The courses for each start will be indicated on a whiteboard on the Race Committee Signal Boat.

3s 3p	Red cylindrical (tall) marked "Aflex"	
4s 4p	Red cylindrical (short) marked "Extraordinary Nelson Tasman"	
1a	Orange truncated with yellow band, self-inflating	
1	Yellow cylindrical, self-inflating	
ss Starting mark starboard end	Race Committee Signal Boat - "Coo-ee"	
SP Starting mark port end	Orange/Pink buoy	
Fs Finishing mark starboard end	Race Committee boat	
FP Finishing mark port end	Orange/Pink buoy
